### Quick Facts

- Departmental Exchange students are admitted to a specific department
- UW quarter system → 10 weeks per quarter
- Full time course enrollment → minimum 12 credits (undergrad), 10 credits (grad); maximum 18 credits (typically 3-4 courses)
- Class formats include lecture and discussion, in-class presentations and case studies
- Grading is based on papers, group projects, case studies, class participation and exams

Departmental exchange students will work with their departmental exchange coordinator at UW to register for classes. Students are responsible for ensuring that the credits they receive will transfer back to their home institution.

**Visiting graduate students** should submit a secondary application through the graduate school for the department to which they have been nominated. Once admitted, students will be expected to take courses largely within the department to which they applied.

Please submit your nominations one month prior to student's application deadlines. When you nominate your students, they will automatically be sent an email with a link to our application and instructions on how to complete their application.

### Application Requirements

**GPA:** Equivalent of 3.0 out of 4.0

#### English Proficiency Requirements\*:

- **TOEFL (IBT):** minimum 76, recommended 92
- **IELTS:** minimum 6.0, recommended 7.0
- **Duolingo:** minimum 105, recommended 120

**Exception:** If your primary and secondary education took place in Australia, Canada (English-speaking provinces), the United Kingdom, Ireland, New Zealand or the U.S., you are exempt from this requirement.

\*Please note that while we have previously accepted a letter attesting to a student's language level, we are moving away from this and request students submit one of the above scores

Additionally, some graduate departments may have a higher language and/or GPA requirement.
